Socio occupational inequalities in breast and lung cancer net survival among Swiss working women

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Breast (BC) and lung (LC) cancer are respectively the cancer with the highest incidence and that with the highest mortality in women. Occupation and socio professional variables can contribute to differences in risk and stage at diagnosis of cancer.

AIM:

- describe socio occupational characteristics
- assess the relationship with breast and lung cancer net survival

POPULATION:

- Women aged 18-65 v
- Western Switzerland (six French-speaking cantons) in the 1990 or 2000 census

8'678 breast and 1'413 lung cancers identified via probabilistic linkage with records from cancer registries (diagnosed between 1990 and 2014).

RESULTS:

BC patients: more frequently employed in manual occupations (13.4% versus 15.6% p 0.02) and with a higher skill level required for the occupation (p<0.001).

LC patients: more frequently Swiss (87% vs 81%, p<0.001) and divorced or widowed (32% vs 20%, p<0.001).

Occupation and socio professional o marked impact on net survival.
